Getting Ready for P1

Sunny Days

Clothes

Please check that there are clothes for children to change into in their bag. When playing outside in the waterfall, the children may get wet!

Foot Wear

As we spend more time outdoors climbing and jumping, we have to insist that you check your child's footwear. *High Fashion Shoes are not always practical.* Ask yourself questions like: -

Are the soles rubber? If NOT please purchase rubber soled shoes. Plastic soles will slip and are dangerous on our equipment.

Do the shoes stay on? We have noticed some shoes fall off, this has obvious consequences.

Are these shoes easy to take off and put on?

Will my child be able to climb in these shoes?
